A Unique Learning Experience

The North Queens Community High School provides students with a supportive and personalized learning environment. Our school features:

- Small class sizes. Each class is limited to 20-25 students. Our total enrollment is no more than 200 students.
- Individualized relationships. Each student is paired with an Advocate Counselor who provides guidance and support as he or she sets and achieves realistic goals.
- Highly qualified staff. Our teachers are experienced in addressing individual learning needs.

A Chance to Grow

Students are encouraged to set goals inside and outside the classroom. We provide young people with opportunities to:

- Share their voice and contribute to the life of the school.
- Form positive relationships with adults in school and in the community.
- Participate in paid internships and community service projects.
- Explore interests and talents in a fun, creative and supportive learning environment.
- Plan for the future. Students receive personal, one-on-one guidance with college, vocational training and career opportunities.

Fast Track to Graduation

- Accelerated credit program so you can earn up to 20 credits a year
- Year-round academic sessions
- Biweekly feedback for students and parents about your academic progress



Is North Queens Community High School Right for You?

We accept students who meet the following criteria:

- At least 16 years old
- Have at least a 6th grade reading level
- Have been enrolled in any NYC high school
- Have been truant or have dropped out of school
- Are ready to commit to a school that will support you in achieving a high school diploma and creating a post-graduation plan
- Live in one of the designated neighborhoods in Queens served by our school

Family Involvement

- Forming a partnership with school staff to support your child in achieving his or her goals.
- Receiving frequent, constructive feedback on your child's progress.
- Seeing your child in a positive learning environment that builds on strengths and prepares students for life after high school.
